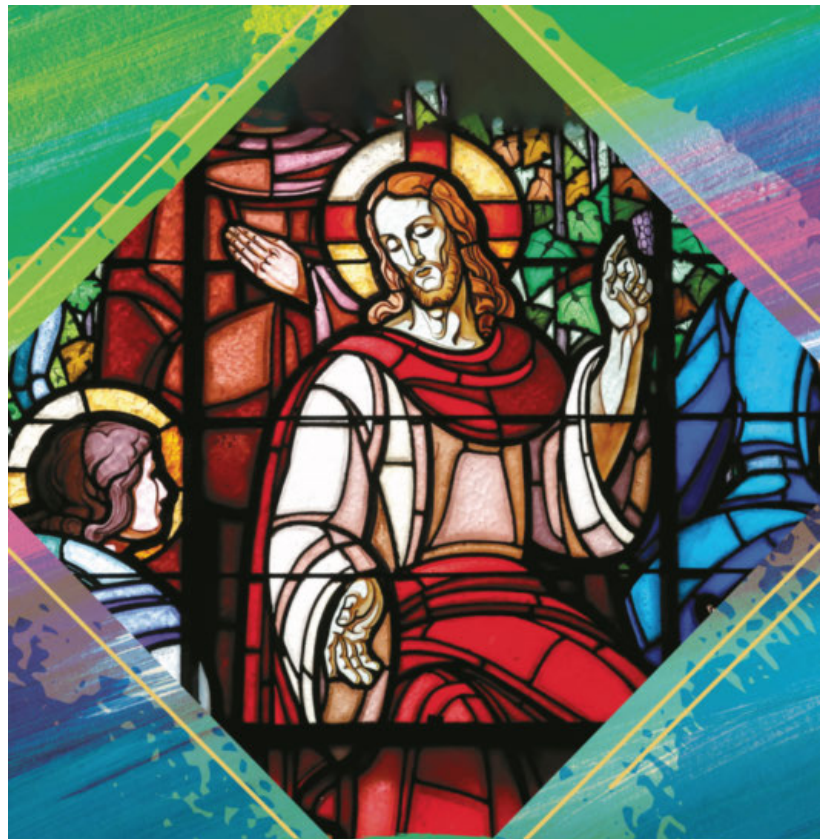

From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters



After a weekday Mass last week, someone asked me if I had my homily written down, since they wanted a copy. Truth is I had prepared it for that particular day- the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross - as I always do, in hand written format; not to read during Mass, but to have an idea of what to say when I get in the pulpit.

Since The Exaltation of the Cross is central to our Catholic Christian belief, I thought it may be worthwhile reminding myself, and the person who asked, of what was said in the liturgy that day.

All of us have a cross in our life. Our crosses can take many forms. The cross is always something tangible, specific. It may be something that happened twenty five years ago, it may be an aspect of our personality, it may be a person we live with, it may be a sickness, it may be an injustice, it may be a situation in work, it may be the death of a loved one.

The cross is the instrument which the Enemy of our soul, the deceiver, the father of lies, uses to make us doubt God's love for us. He shows us our cross and says 'You see, if God is so good, explain this to me! Why would God allow this to happen to you? You know why? Because deep down he does not love you. If you were God, you would do a much better job. To hell with religion, the church, the priests, all this is nonsense, take your life in your own hands and fix it, because only you are able to.' Well, in those or similar words.

The cross is always an experience of limitation, it is humbling. Eve had a cross in the Garden of Eden. God had placed her in Paradise, giving everything to her, with the exception of one fruit. She fixates on this, and cannot accept that she cannot have it. She believes the lie: 'you cannot have it, you cannot do what you want, your life is not the way you want, because God is jealous of you.' She believes this lie and falls. Sin is always a result of rejecting the cross in our life.

The only one who has not doubted the love of God when confronted with the cross is Jesus Christ. He experienced all that we do, and when faced with the cross he cried out in our humanity "Eli, Eli, Lama Sabbachtani – My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" To feel forsaken, cut off, abandoned, deprived of the face of God – this is the experience of Hell itself, it is the most terrible anguish a person can experience. Jesus Christ experienced this, and yet he did not doubt God's love.

He embraced the cross, saying 'Even if I do not understand why this is happening, even if I do not see the meaning of this now, I know that you, my God, are love, that you love me, and that you will not abandon me to death.' The cross is the place where he meets the love of God.

What Jesus experienced in his flesh, we also experience sacramentally in the liturgy. In God's own way, and in his own time, the Crosses in our life can become enlightened, and we begin to understand why they are there. When you think about it, God has always waited for us at a crossroads in our life. In front of the cross, we either throw everything out of the window, or transcend our selves through the grace of Christ and experience the love of God in that very circumstance.

The Holy Humility of Christ! He could have called down a legion of angels to wipe out his enemies, those who were mistreating him, but he did not do so. He embraces the cross, not out of stoicism, or resignation, but really believing that God the Father loves him, and that he allows the cross as a means, the only means, to experience that love. May the cross which you and I have today be enlightened, may our crosses be, in virtue of Christ, an occasion for us to experience the immense love which God has for us.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas



Después de una Misa diaria la semana pasada, alguien me preguntó si tenía mi homilía escrita, ya que querían una copia. La verdad es que la había preparado para ese día en particular - la Solemnidad de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz - como siempre hago, en formato escrito a mano; no para leer durante la Misa, sino para tener una idea de qué decir cuando llego al púlpito.

Ya que La Exaltación de la Santa Cruz es central para nuestra creencia Cristiana Católica, pensé que valdría la pena recordarme, y a la persona que preguntó, lo que se dijo en la liturgia ese día.

Todos nosotros tenemos una cruz en nuestra vida. Nuestras cruces pueden tomar muchas formas. La cruz es siempre algo tangible, específico. Puede ser algo que sucedió hace veinticinco años, puede ser un aspecto de nuestra personalidad, puede ser una persona con la que vivimos, puede ser una enfermedad, puede ser una injusticia, puede ser una situación de trabajo, puede ser la muerte de un ser querido.

La cruz es el instrumento que el Enemigo de nuestra alma, el engañador, el padre de la mentira, usa para hacernos dudar del amor de Dios por nosotros. Nos muestra nuestra cruz y nos dice: 'Ves, si Dios es tan bueno, explícame esto! ¿Por qué permitiría Dios que esto te pasara? ¿Sabes por qué? Porque en el fondo no te ama. Si fueras Dios, harías un trabajo mucho mejor. Al diablo con la religión, la iglesia, los sacerdotes, todo esto es una tontería, toma tu vida en tus propias manos y arréglala, porque solo tú puedes.' Bueno, en esas o palabras similares.

La cruz es siempre una experiencia de limitación, es humillante. Eva tenía una cruz en el Huerto del Edén. Dios la había puesto en el Paraíso, dándole todo, con la excepción de un fruto. Ella se fija en esto, y no puede aceptar que no puede tenerlo. Ella cree la mentira: 'no puedes tenerlo, no puedes hacer lo que quieres, tu vida no es como quieres, porque Dios está celoso de ti.' Ella cree esta mentira y cae. El pecado es siempre el resultado de rechazar la cruz en nuestra vida.

El único que no ha dudado del amor de Dios cuando fue confrontado con la cruz es Jesucristo. Él experimentó todo lo que hacemos, y cuando se enfrentó a la cruz gritó en nuestra humanidad "Eli, Eli, Lama Sabbachtani - Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?" Sentirse abandonado, cortado, abandonado, privado del rostro de Dios - esta es la experiencia del Infierno mismo, es la angustia más terrible que una persona puede experimentar. Jesucristo experimentó esto, y sin embargo no dudó del amor de Dios.

Abrazó la cruz, diciendo: Aunque no entiendo por qué está sucediendo esto, aunque no veo el significado de esto ahora, sé que tú, mi Dios, eres amor, que me amas, y que no me abandonarás a la muerte. La cruz es el lugar donde él encuentra el amor de Dios.

Lo que Jesús experimentó en su carne, también lo experimentamos sacramentalmente en la liturgia. A la manera de Dios, y en su tiempo, las Cruces en nuestra vida pueden ser iluminadas, y comenzamos a entender por qué están allí. Cuando lo piensas, Dios siempre nos ha esperado en una encrucijada en nuestra vida. Frente a la cruz, o tiramos todo por la ventana, o trascendemos a nosotros mismos a través de la gracia de Cristo y experimentamos el amor de Dios en esa misma circunstancia.

¡La Santa Humildad de Cristo! Podría haber llamado a una legión de ángeles para acabar con sus enemigos, los que lo maltrataban, pero no lo hizo. Él abraza la cruz, no por estoicismo, o resignación, sino realmente creyendo que Dios el Padre lo ama, y que permite la cruz como un medio, el único medio, para experimentar ese amor. Que la cruz que vosotros y yo tenemos hoy sea iluminada, que nuestras cruces sean, en virtud de Cristo, ocasión para que experimentemos el inmenso amor que Dios tiene por nosotros.

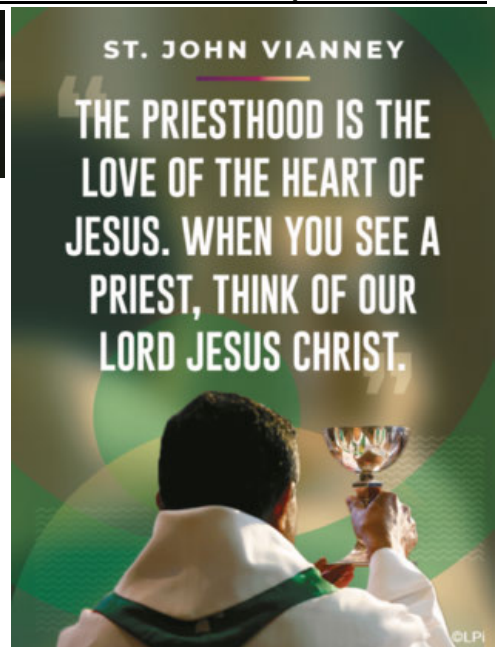
I hope you see your priest as very human. Quite possibly, even more human than most of us. Why? Because they not only have their own struggles being human, but they accompany us in our humanness too.
