

## A Reflection From Our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters



'There was a landowner who planted a vineyard...'

Few cultivated crops or plants are so completely dependent on both the careful, skilled work of a gardener and on the rhythm of the seasons as the vine. The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, refer constantly to the vine, the vineyard, and the vine-dresser. The highly esteemed vine is touched with mystery. It is worth nothing except in its fruit. While the wood of the vine is worthless (Ezekiel 15,2) and the barren branches good only for the fire (John 15,6), the fruit of the vine makes 'gods and men' happy (Judges 9,13).

The God of Israel is the spouse and vinedresser of the vine which is His people. But this spousal relationship is marked by unfaithfulness, a lack of gratitude and infidelity. For the prophet Hosea, Israel is a fruitful plant which gives thanks for its fruitfulness to others, rather than the God who is her spouse by the covenant. Isaiah says that God loves his vine and he has done everything for it; but instead of the anticipated fruit of justice, his vine-harvest has been poured out blood; therefore he will hand over his plant to despoilers. For Jeremiah, Israel is a chosen plant become degenerate and barren, to be uprooted and trampled. Finally, Ezekiel speaks of the fertile vine which dries up and is burned, and applies this to an Israel unfaithful to God.

It is against this background that Jesus speaks of the parable in the Gospel we hear at Mass today.

Israel refused to listen to the prophets who were sent to her. She did so because the prophets were never politically correct; they did not say what Israel wanted to hear. The prophets' words are always a call to sincerity, to authenticity, to truth, and to conversion of heart.

There are prophets in our life. Not to listen to them means lack of justice and bloodshed. Justice is defined as 'rendering to others what is their due'. What is due to others? Respect, courtesy, understanding, a listening ear, a helping hand, a shoulder to help carry a burden, a kindness unrewarded; in other words, forgiveness of their sins, Love.

Lack of justice always means death, bloodshed. "If you call your brother/sister 'fool' you have already murdered him in your heart" Jesus says in the Sermon on the Mount. Saint John tells us in his First Letter, that 'we know that we have passed from death to life because we love our brother'.

Love is the fruit of the vine which we have been cultivated to produce. This fruit, however, can only be given if we are united to Christ. He is the one who has not slandered, not hated, not shown violence to others, has rendered justice. He has loved by dying to himself for the sake of even the ungrateful and unfaithful.

Isaiah prophesied that a day will come when the vine flourishes under God's watchful care. To this we, the new Israel, call on God's faithful love asking that He save the vine he transplanted from Egypt to His land, the vine he had to leave to destruction and fire.

## Una Reflexión de Nuestro Pastor

*Queridos hermanos y hermanas*



'Había un terrateniente que plantó un viñedo...'

Algunas cosechas o plantaciones son completamente dependientes del trabajo cuidadoso y expert de un jardinero y del crecimiento de la viña. Las Escrituras, tanto el Antiguo como el Nuevo Testamento, se refieren constantemente a la vid, la viña y el viñador. La muy estimada vid está llena de misterio. ¿acaso la madera de parra vale más que las otras maderas o que las ramas de los arboles del bosque? (Ezequiel 15,2) y las ramas estériles solo son buenas para el fuego (Juan 15,60), el fruto de la vid hace felices a 'dioses y hombres' (Jueces 9,13).

El Dios de Israel es el esposo y viñador de la vid que es Su pueblo. Pero esta relación conyugal está marcada por la infidelidad, la falta de gratitud y la infidelidad. Para el profeta Oseas, Israel es una planta fructífera que da gracias por su fecundidad a los demás, en lugar del Dios que es su esposo por el pacto. Isaías dice que Dios ama su vid y que ha hecho todo por ella; pero en lugar del fruto anticipado de la justicia, su cosecha de vid ha sido derramada sangre; por lo tanto, entregará su planta a los saqueadores. Para Jeremías, Israel es una planta elegida degenerada y estéril, para ser desarraigada y pisoteada. Finalmente, Ezequiel habla de la vid fértil que se seca y se quema, y aplica esto a un Israel infiel a Dios.

Es en este contexto que Jesús habla de la parábola en el Evangelio que escuchamos hoy en la Misa.

Israel se negó a escuchar a los profetas que fueron enviados a ella. Lo hizo porque los profetas nunca fueron políticamente correctos; no dijeron lo que Israel quería oír. Las palabras de los profetas son siempre una llamada a la sinceridad, a la autenticidad, a la verdad y a la conversión del corazón.

Hay profetas en nuestra vida. No escucharlos significa falta de justicia y derramamiento de sangre. La justicia se define como 'rendir a los demás lo que es debido'. ¿Qué es debido a los demás? Respeto, cortesía, comprensión, un oído de escucha, una mano de ayuda, un hombro para ayudar a llevar una carga, una bondad sin recompensa; en otras palabras, perdón de sus pecados, Amor.

La falta de justicia siempre significa muerte, derramamiento de sangre. "Si llamas 'tonto' a tu hermano/ hermana, ya lo has asesinado en tu corazón" dice Jesús en el Sermón de la Montaña. San Juan nos dice en su Primera Carta que sabemos que hemos pasado de la muerte a la vida porque amamos a nuestro hermano.

El amor es el fruto de la vid para la que hemos sido cultivados. Sin embargo, este fruto solo puede darse si estamos unidos a Cristo. Él es el que no ha calumniado, no ha odiado, no ha mostrado violencia a los demás, ha hecho justicia. Él ha amado muriendo a sí mismo por el bien de los desagradecidos e infieles.

Isaías profetizó que un día vendrá cuando la vid florezca bajo el cuidado vigilante de Dios. A esto nosotros, el nuevo Israel, invocamos el amor fiel de Dios pidiendo que salve la vid que trasplantó de Egipto a su tierra, la vid que tuvo que dejar a la destrucción y al fuego.


